Fire is **FAST**! In less than 30 seconds a small flame can turn into a major fire. It only takes minutes for a house to be engulfed in flames.



Fire is **HOT**! Room temperatures in a fire can be 100 degrees at floor level and rise to 600 degrees at eye level.



Fire is **DARK**! Fire starts bright, but quickly produces black smoke and complete darkness.



Fire is **DEADLY**! Smoke and toxic gases kill more people than flames do. Fire produces poisonous gases that make you disoriented and drowsy.
